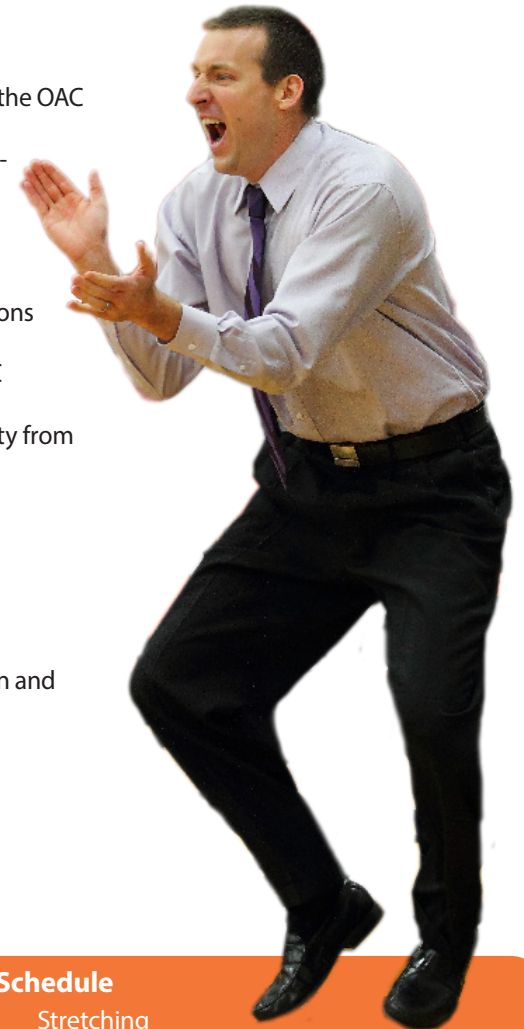
- Led Heidelberg to an 8-18 record, going 6-12 in the OAC
